



## Restore Your Heart, Restore the Church, Restore the Cathedral

We started our day with what is reminiscent of a pilgrimage, as we unceremoniously proceeded with many faith-filled seekers through the majestic doors of [St. Patrick's Cathedral](#). On a brisk but beautiful Saturday morning, we approached this prestigious landmark from a block away; the tall spires reassuring us of our proximity. Nearing this magnificent structure, we saw that it was smothered in scaffolding. It is a time of "restoration transformation" for this sacred dwelling that offers Jesus to everyone. A sign on the outside of this massive bulwark of Catholic life and faith reads: "In a city that never sleeps, everyone needs a place to pray." Once inside, we discovered the "restoration transformation" is also occurring within the interior. Enormous scaffolding did not hinder anyone from praying or worshipping within this consecrated space. It was as if a magnetic force drew all of us to move with reverence around the aisles. Each alcove, just as before the restoration initiative began, offered a saint's encouragement. Their lives are an inspiration to us as we look to them for strength and solace in our desires and struggles to be people of faith.

Pulled by a childlike need to be part of this church, to put faith into action, we could not help but want to light candles for our many needs and intentions. Reflecting on the aches and desires of my own heart, I wondered which Saint in the multiple alcoves should I request to intercede to our Lord on behalf of my poor prayers? How many candles must be lighted for assurance that I covered all the needs and people I want to bring to these holy warriors' attention? I asked these spiritual heroes to bring comfort and support to all those for whom I prayed.

The needs of the Church are immense. I saw the scaffolding outside of St. Patrick's Cathedral to be such a metaphor for who we are now, a Catholic Church, who on the outside looks to some as if we are crumbling and unable hold ourselves upright. We, the people, are also in need of undergoing a "restoration transformation." Entering this strong edifice, to see that there was scaffolding erected inside the building as well, reminded me that our restoration from the sexual abuse crisis of the Catholic Church needs to be on the interior as well as the exterior of the Church, for myself and for all of us. 
