Starting Easter Monday eight men are scheduled to be executed by the State of Arkansas. Four double executions are scheduled through April 27, an unprecedented act for our state and nation.

Bishop Anthony B. Taylor is asking all Catholics to contact Gov. Asa Hutchinson to commute the death sentences to life without parole for Don Davis and Bruce Earl Ward (scheduled to be executed April 17), Ledelle Lee and Stacey Johnson (scheduled to be executed April 20), Marcel Williams and Jack Jones, Jr. (scheduled to be executed April 24), Jason McGehee and Kenneth Williams (scheduled to be executed April 27).

Convicted of terrible acts, each of these men has a God-given right to life. The gift of life should only be taken by God
